
From my Windows 10 HP laptop:




I clicked the "Stay on Windows 10 for now" option.

Then I had the computer install the "2025-07 Cumulative Update Preview for Windows 10 Version 22H2 x64-based Systems (KB5062649)" update.

After that update, I let it install the "2025-06 Update for Windows 10 Version 22H2 for x64-based Systems (KB5001716)" update. (It kind of snuck in by only showing a "Retry" button.)

Now my system is up to date and I do not yet have an option to enroll in the Extended Security Updates (ESU) program.



If I find that there is too much nagging about upgrading to Windows 11, I might uninstall the last update KB5001716 as the info about the update says it's going to show warnings about the version being unsupported.
